MEDIA RELEASE: WA Needs to Be Wary of Rising Inequality

"Western Australia needs to be wary of the impact of growing inequality within our community, with recent reports pointing to a growing gap in wealth and savings between those on the top incomes and those at the bottom," warned Irina Cattalini CEO of WACOSS.

"The ACOSS Report A Nation Divided: Inequality in Australia found that while a person in the top 20% income group had five times the income of someone in the bottom 20%, they had

Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability - Recruiting New Members

The Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability (MACD) is advertising for new members. One position will become vacant in June and two more will be vacated in December.

The Council is legislated to represent all perspectives of disability and therefore, applicants will be held on file for a period of two years for possible recruitment as vacancies occur.
