Expression of Interest: Learning for Purpose Program

The University of Western Australia Centre for Social Impact (UWA CSI), the Western Australian Council of Social Services (WACOSS) and BHP Billiton have joined together to offer the Action Learning program for the first time in 2016.

The Action Learning program brings together highly motivated participants who seek to make a difference in their organisations and the community they serve. By grouping learners both within and across organisations to share experiences and knowledge about real organisational problems the community service sector faces, the program builds collective leadership capacity that will facilitate the implementation of positive organisational change.

Applicants must represent community service sector organisations operating in Western Australia. Organisations that address issues of Health or Mental Health, Drug and Alcohol, Disability, Housing and Homelessness, and Youth and Youth Welfare, as well as indigenous organisations and/or those operating in regional WA are strongly encouraged to apply.

The program is designed to build participants' capacity to tackle important organisational challenges and initiate change to address them. To facilitate this, participants should hold positions that best enable them to instigate change within the organisation, such as CEO; Board Director; Executive-, General-, Senior Manager; Human Resource Director. Individuals in less formal leadership positions are still encouraged to apply, but should clearly

demonstrate the impact they can have.

Over a period of four months, the Action Learning program will address the domains of strategy, leadership, funding, and talent to equip community sector leader with the knowledge, skills, and capabilities relevant to achieve social change.

Participation in the Action Learning program will be offered at no cost to selected members of WA community sector organisations with two programs being offered in 2016.

UWA Centre for Social Impact Outcomes Measurement Study

In a study funded by the Bankwest Foundation, the University of Western Australia Centre for Social Impact is undertaking ground-breaking research examining the state of play in outcomes measurement in the West Australian community sector.

The study is led by Professor Paul Flatau and seeks to explore the current state of outcomes measurement in Western Australia, key barriers and challenges faced by community sector organisations, and the relationship between funders and outcomes measurement. Understanding outcomes measurement enables organisations to better understand the difference they are making and the most effective way of supporting clients; provides recognition of the value delivered by community organisations, and strengthens the case for funding of community organisations.

The survey represents the first step towards understanding the state of outcomes measurement in Western Australia, and will inform future initiatives to reduce barriers and improve outcomes measurement. The important findings of the study will ensure that the impact of community organisations in Western Australia is widely recognised.

This new portal is the result of an exciting collaboration between Landgate and the Department of Parks and Wildlife. The Department has been doing excellent work making open data discoverable and very generously lent Landgate one of its own, Florian Mayer to get the portal up and running.

Over 300 datasets from Landgate's [Shared Location Information Platform](#) (SLIP) have been added to the portal. SLIP is the home for the geospatial data collected by many WA government agencies, and provides a single point-of-entry to discover, understand, and reuse data such as property information, road, rail, and water infrastructure and much more.

Rise Network - Office Space Available March/April 2016

Rise is purchasing a property in Cockburn with a view to creating a NFP hub. Rise have been in discussion with complementary service providers about entering arrangements to “share” space in the building. The goal is to establish a ‘One-Stop-Shop’ type space that adds value to visitors to the premises.

As a disability service provider the building meets (and in many ways exceeds) universal design principles. It is accessible for people with disability and has toileting and changing facility to meet the needs of people with complex physical disability. There is accessible parking and shared parking spaces for staff/visitors. There will also be access to shared multipurpose meeting rooms, reception space and staffed reception (during regular office hours) – somewhat like a Professional Managed Suite

Rise are inviting Community Groups / Service Providers to contact Rise to express an interest in sharing this space or learning more about the opportunity. Rates are based on the needs of the external party – be that access to a Hotdesk, dedicated m2 permanent desks and/or offices for their fulltime staff etc. Costs will reflect a cost-plus approach that is affordable to Community and Not-for-Profit sectors. We are anticipating the building becoming available March/ April 2016.

HUGS Now Unavailable Through Financial Counsellors

As of 1 Oct 2015, people who wish to apply for a Hardship Utilities Grant will need to negotiate a payment arrangement directly with their utility. Hardship Utilities Grants will no longer be available through financial counsellors.

"If you approach a utility for a HUGS grant and are told you must meet with a financial counsellor before it is granted, be aware that recent funding cuts mean the number of financial counsellors across WA has been greatly reduced," Charlie Brown, Executive Officer of FCAWA. "It's likely you won't be able to get an appointment for several weeks."
