Fair Work Australia Increases Minimum Wage

On 3 June 2011, Fair Work Australia awarded a percentage increase of 3.4% to award wages, which amounts to lifting the National Minimum Wage by \$19.40 a week to \$589.30 or \$15.51 an hour from 1 July, 2011.

This means that the Federal minimum wage is increased by .51 cents per hour. This is not an across the board increase, but all award rates must be increased individually by 3.4%.

If your staff are paid in excess of 3.4% above the award rate of pay you do not need to pass on this increase – but be mindful of pay relativities between classifications. <u>Click here</u> to read this article in full
