Changes benefit retirement village residents

Amendments to laws governing retirement villages will ensure residents have clearer information about the fees they are required to pay and will make operators more accountable for the services they provide.

Commerce Minister Michael Mischin said the changes would be phased in over the next 16 months.

"Under the amendments, retirement village contracts must include specific information about the fees and charges a resident will pay across the term of the contract," Mr Mischin said. [Read more...](#)

Both service providers and users cite information sharing issues - notably around informed client consent and what client information can and cannot be shared - as one of the key barriers to service coordination.
