MEDIA RELEASE: WA Budget Builds Social Housing But Lacks Big Picture, Thurs 14 May 2015

The Western Australian Council of Social Service (WACOSS) has welcomed the central State Budget allocation to public housing as foundational for social wellbeing in WA, but overall the Budget needs to take a longer term view of investment in the social service system.

"While its investment in social infrastructure is very welcome, it has failed to balance that with social services that deliver a return on investment and prevent growth in demand for acute care," said Irina Cattalini, CEO of WACOSS. [Read More...](#)

Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability - Recruiting New Members

The Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability (MACD) is advertising for new members. One position will become vacant in June and two more will be vacated in December.

The Council is legislated to represent all perspectives of disability and therefore, applicants will be held on file for a period of two years for possible recruitment as vacancies occur. Members are eligible to complete two terms of two years each and a third term of two years only if they are appointed as Chairperson. All appointments are by the Minister for Disability Services.

What is Law Access?

Law Access is a pro bono referral service established by the Law Society of Western Australia that matches applications for pro bono (free, or reduced cost) legal assistance from individuals and not-for-profit organisations to lawyers in the profession. The Law Access services is operated through Law Access Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Law Society.

Law Access helps people who are financially disadvantaged (utilising a means test like Legal Aid), where we assess that their matter has reasonable prospects of success and where Legal Aid or a community legal centre have been unable to help the individual due to their limited resources.

Law Access is also very interested in potential public interest cases that not-for-profit organisations might refer.
