WACOSS Supports National Statement on Paid Parental Leave

ACOSS and WACOSS have both signed on to support a joint national statement on access to Paid Parental Leave. The Scheme enacted by the Parliament has the twin objectives of enhancing child and maternal well being and supporting parental work force participation. The universal Government scheme underpins whatever employees are able to obtain by negotiation with employers, with the aim of extending total paid leave as close as possible to a full 26 weeks recommended by the World Health Organisation. ERA Approval of Financial Hardship Policy - Water Corporation

The Economic Regulation Authority has approved the Water Corporation's amended financial hardship policy.

On 11 December 2014, the Water Corporation submitted a revised hardship policy for the Authority's approval. The Authority considered the Water Corporation's proposal for a tenant to seek their landlord's approval to enter into a payment plan to be inconsistent with the Water Services Code of Conduct (Customer Service Standards) 2013 and decided not to approve the revised hardship policy.

The Authority has decided to approve the Water Corporation's amended hardship policy as submitted on 27 March 2015. The Authority's [decision](#) and a copy of the Water Corporation's amended hardship policy can be found on the Authority's website.

Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability - Recruiting New Members

The Ministerial Advisory Council on Disability (MACD) is advertising for new members. One position will become vacant in June and two more will be vacated in December.

The Council is legislated to represent all perspectives of disability and therefore, applicants will be held on file for a period of two years for possible recruitment as vacancies occur. Members are eligible to complete two terms of two years each and a third term of two years only if they are appointed as Chairperson. All appointments are by the Minister for Disability Services.
