Changes to the Associations Incorporations Bill 2014

The long awaited Associations Incorporation Bill 2014 was introduced into Western Australian Parliament and passed by the Lower House in March 2015. The Bill is currently being debated in the Upper House.

When the Bill is passed, all 18,000+ incorporated associations will need to understand how the changes will impact on them. WACOSS will be working with the WA Department of Commerce to provide resource on line. However it is important you stay in touch with the changes.
