#### **Financial Counselling**

#### **Ngala Parenting Line**

Ngala run a free telephone support service for WA parents and caregivers of children from conception to 18 years. Parents are supported with up to date child development information, parenting support and referrals. The Parenting Line operates as a call-back service. To request a call, contact **9368 9368**. The free call number for country callers using a landline is 1800 111 546. The service operates between **8 am to 8 pm, seven days a week,** including public holidays.

#### **Positive Parenting Program**

The Triple P - Positive Parenting Program, gives parents and carers ideas and strategies to help their child develop the skills and behaviours they need for a healthy childhood. # Support available to community organisations and schools

Below is a list of services which may be able to assist organisations with the support they are able to provide. These are not suitable to share directly with community members.

## **Dandelions WA - backpacks**

Dandelions WA provide brand-new school backpacks filled with essential items like stationery, lunch boxes, water bottles, hats, and toiletries. Schools and organisations who can distribute backpacks to students can register online for supplies <u>https://www.dandelionswa.org.au/schools</u>

### Variety EduKids Grant

Variety EduKids Grants help WA kids receive an essential education by providing funding for school equipment. Assistance is available directly to government primary and high schools to support disadvantaged children. #### **Give Write – stationary packs**

## **DijiRed - devices for students**

DijiRed's Laptops for Students initiative recycles digital devices and provides them to students at a reduced fee. Fee structure varies between \$150-\$800 depending on the device available.
